The exhibition **Seventy Years of Polish Archaeology in Egypt** was presented at the Egyptian Museum in Cairo (21 October – 21 November 2007, extended to 21 December) in commemoration of seventy years that have passed since Polish archaeologists first began work in Egypt. The *Exhibition Catalogue*, published simultaneously in English and Arabic, presented all of the objects selected from 9 of the 26 sites where Polish missions are working or have worked in the past. Accompanying the catalogue was an album with essays written by the individual excavators, providing a comprehensive panorama of the Polish archaeological effort in Egypt since the day that Kazimierz Michałowski, the founder of the Polish Centre, stuck the first spade in the ground in Tell Edfu in 1937.

The present CD edition brings the full content of the hardback volumes in their original form.
