Round-Table Themes

The 4th International ILA Round-Table follows up on themes suggested during the 2nd and 3rd Round Tables at Millau and Olten, respectively, that is, lamps and lighting devices in prehistoric times and in the conditions of underground mines.

The location has been chosen specifically to combine the two experiences: the Neolithic flint mines at Krzemionki Opatowskie in southeastern Poland offer an incomparable opportunity to develop the topic of how light was brought into and used in a prehistoric mine.

The duality of the topic chosen for the Round-Table in Poland is intended as a means of allowing, on one hand, in-depth discussion of prehistoric lighting methods and devices, the development of which will lead in effect to the lamps of Antiquity. On the other hand, the focus on the way light is used in mining conditions in a prehistoric mine and then in a medieval salt mine will bring to the fore technical and functional issues that permit a better understanding of how lighting devices work. The objective is to provide a forum for relevant papers on light and lighting in prehistoric times (before the Roman Age in Europe north of the Alps) and in mines (all periods), but also, and more importantly, to encourage excavators to present unpublished material from their sites in an effort to broaden the source base of lamps and lighting available for study. In effect, for example, a number of "lamps" from prehistoric times, identified as such by excavators, may be either proved or disproved as lighting devices.

Sessions

The sessions will take place at the facilities of the Historical-Archaeological Museum in **Ostrowiec Swietokrzyski** with a workshop on lighting organized inside the flint mines. Participants will have the opportunity to go down into a mine not normally visited by tourists and to experiment with light underground. The RT will close with a visit to the salt mines in Wieliczka near Kraków.

Participants will be taken to the conference venue by bus from Warsaw on Monday morning and will return to Warsaw in the late evening on Wednesday. Hotel facilities will be arranged in Ostrowiec for the TR. The Wednesday excursion to Wieliczka is included in the program.

Participants will be welcome to stay on in Warsaw for Thursday and Friday (**November 6-7, 2008**) to attend a **sub-RT** organized in Warsaw by the Polish Centre of Mediterranean Archaeology of Warsaw University. This mini-conference is intended as a review of lamp and lighting *varia* from excavations carried out by the Polish Center in Egypt and the Near East. (www.pcma.uw.edu.pl)

Participants are encouraged to plan their stay in Warsaw so as to include the weekend of Saturday and Sunday November 1-2. They will thus have an opportunity to join in the Polish Roman Catholic tradition of bringing lights to the cemeteries on All Souls' Day in remembrance of the dearly departed (en.wikipedia.org/wiki/All Souls' Day).
